

Yes. Players who cancel their membership may rejoin the program later under the following condition:

- **The monthly membership fees for the months you were not a part of the program will be due at the time you rejoin.** (Example – if you cancelled for the months of December, January, and February, and wish to rejoin in March, then a \$147 rejoining fee will be due). The rejoining fee will be equal to the amount of months your membership was cancelled, or \$49 per month.

This fee is not, in any way, assessed as a punishment for canceling. It is done to prevent a family from possibly taking advantage of the program only during the programs “[peak](#)” months. It is also done as a courtesy to the other members of the Carolina Elite program. With these group practices, I have to teach the entire group at a level understandable by the least experienced player in attendance. Although this is necessary, and in many cases unavoidable, I want to limit the frequency in which it occurs. If players are allowed to stop and start with no consequence, it will end up hindering the learning process of the players who have been attending on a more consistent basis.
